Where are you from? Where do you live now?

I'm from Littleton, Colorado. Technically it's Highlands Ranch/Lone Tree, aka the southern most Denver suburb before you end up in Castle Rock. But now I live in Los Angeles and desperately miss thunderstorms.

How long have you been writing? How did you start writing?

I started writing when I was 34. I had a creative writing teacher in high school that made me feel too stupid to write. I guess I *was* pretty stupid, because even though I always had some great stories going on in my head, I believed him and didn't write any of them down. Until I finally got an idea that wouldn't let me not write it down. Unfortunately, it wasn't *Not After Everything*. I had to write four other manuscripts before that one.

What is your writing process?

I find it changes with each book. Sometimes I meticulously plot, sometimes I lightly outline. Sometimes I write from 11:00pm until about 4:00am. Sometimes I have to sit down at exactly 5:00pm and write until 11:00pm every single day. Sometimes I absolutely can't write at my house—I've drafted entire books at Starbucks. The thing that remains consistent in my writing process is that I draft fast. I drafted *Not After Everything* in five weeks. Personally, I have to vomit the words onto the page so that I have something to work with and go from there.

What do you find to be the most difficult part of the writing process?

The easiest for me is drafting. When I have an idea it all comes rushing out at once. The most difficult would be revising without guidance. Those first revisions before I ask my critique partners to give me notes just about kill me.

Where are your books set? Why?

Not After Everything is set in a fictional version of the Denver suburb I lived in when I was in High School. My previous manuscripts were set in Connecticut, Los Angeles, and Northern California, so I don't really know why I chose that for *NAE*. It was just where that story decided it wanted to take place, I guess.

Are your characters based on real people?

Not even a little bit.

Where do the ideas for your books come from?

My ideas mostly start with the characters. *Not After Everything* happened because Tyler's voice popped into my head one day and I had to figure out what his story was.

Who is your favorite author?

There are so many! Jandy Nelson, Laini Taylor, Andrew Smith, Gayle Forman, Lauren Oliver, Libba Bray, and John Green, just to name a few.

When you aren't writing, what do you like to do for fun?

I like going to movies and plays and watching TV and reading books. Anything with great storytelling!

Do you do school visits?
